Enrolments 2019

A reminder that you need to enrol your children in a public school for 2019 if they are:

- * starting Kindergarten - 4 years old by 30 June 2019
- * starting Pre-Primary (first year of compulsory school) - 5 years old by 30 June 2019
- * starting Year 7 (first year of secondary school)
- * changing schools

All children from Pre-Primary to Year 12 are guaranteed a place at their local school. Please be aware Bramfield Park PS is a local intake school which identifies a designated geographical area from which enrolments are accepted. Applications from outside the local intake area are prioritised in accordance with the School Education Regulations 2000.

Current Kindergarten students have received an Application for enrolment form for Pre-Primary 2019. Please ensure these are completed and returned to the Office as soon as possible.

Current Year 6 students need to ensure an application has been made to enrol into High School.

If you have any queries, please don't hesitate to come and see us in the Office.

Preparing your child for schooling at Bramfield

It is always wonderful to see families reading reports together and having an opportunity to discuss with the teacher their child's strengths and celebrations and focus areas for the coming term. 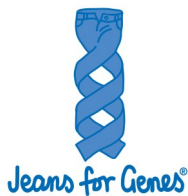
