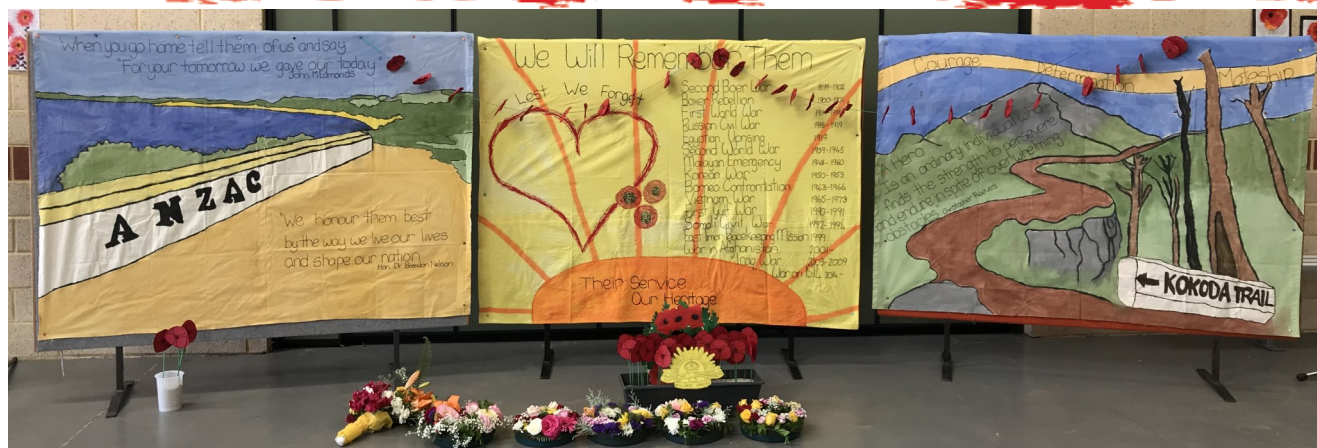




BRAMFIELD PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

The ANZAC service itself was lovely with a focus this year on the nurses who so bravely gave medical care to injured soldiers. An excerpt from our service about the nurses;

More than 3,000 Australian civilian nurses volunteered for active service during World War I. From the first landings at Gallipoli on 25 April 1915, Australian nurses cared for hundreds of casualties in hospital and on transport ships anchored offshore. Working in often gruelling conditions, with limited medical supplies and a desperate lack of fresh water, they tended to a seemingly endless stream of wounded and sick soldiers for the duration of the campaign.

Lieutenant Paula Evans from Joint Health Command said about the nurses in World War 1:

"Their dedication to duty and unwavering compassion and care in the grimmest of times and in the harshest of environments cannot fail to inspire. Their persistent and exceptional delivery of health care is still the basic tenet of what we do today."

NAPLAN Online

Next week students in Years 3 and 5 will be completing the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy. This will include assessments for writing, reading, language conventions and Numeracy. All of these tests for Year 5 will be online and all tests for Year 3 will be online except for writing. Assessments will commence next Tuesday 14th May and there is a two week testing period. Students have had a look at the type of assessments that will be in NAPLAN so the necessary preparations have been made in class. Uniform

A reminder that at Bramfield Park PS the School Board have approved a Uniform Policy where it is expected students will wear our school uniform every day. The Uniform Shop is open twice a week and orders can be placed at the Office if needed outside of these times. With the change in weather, students will need a school jumper, which needs to be clearly labelled as students tend to remove their jumper throughout the day as the weather warms up. There seems to be a number of students wearing other jumpers and track pants where our expectation is for the track pants to be plain black and the jumpers to be a school jacket or a plain black or red jumper / jacket. It is not acceptable to have logos on clothing worn to school. Jackets in Lost Property certainly accumulate throughout the term so please ask your child to check regularly for lost or missing items.

We will be starting a Breakfast Club every Tuesday morning from 8:10am.

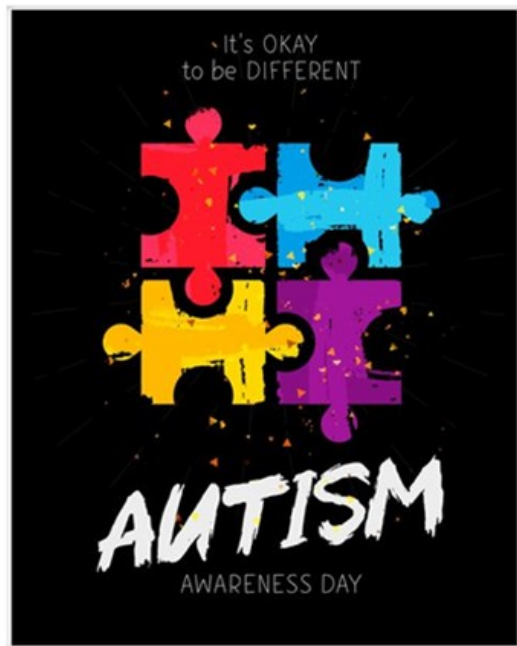
