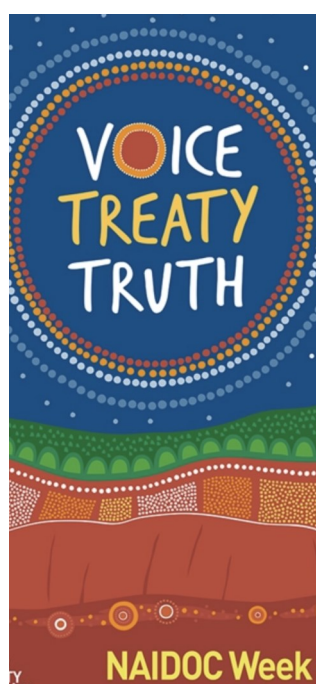

Reporting to Parents Interviews

Thank you to all those families that were able to make the Reporting to Parents Interviews at the end of last term. It was wonderful for the teachers to have the opportunity to talk to their students and their families about progress and achievement throughout first semester. Across the school we had an average of 95% attendance of families at an interview to receive the Semester One Report. What a wonderful success!

Enrolments 2020

A reminder that enrolments are now being taken for kindergarten next year. Changes to the Public Health Act 2016 (WA) and the School Education Act 1999 (WA) have introduced immunisation requirements for enrolment into child care services, community kindergartens and schools. Kindergarten enrolments will only be accepted if a student has a current 'up to date' Immunisation History Form. Students in Pre-primary to Year 6 enrolments without 'up to date' immunisation will be accepted but it will be marked on their enrolment records that will be reported to the Department of Health.

Year 6 students also need to complete an application for enrolment into High School in 2020.

NAIDOC

NAIDOC (National Aborigines and Islanders Day of Observance Committee) was celebrated at Bramfield Park last Friday. We were very lucky to have our special guest and parent at school Delvene Cornwall to present to all classes some Aboriginal Culture. Ms Cornwall also brought another special guest, Mrs Southern who not only shared some of her expertise of Aboriginal Culture but made a yummy morning tea with bush tucker food for the staff. Our Aboriginal and Islander Education Officer, Auntie Josie, also spent time with every class sharing stories, language and cultural artefacts. A very big thank you to Mrs Landsborough for coordinating the day's events and preparing our end of day Assembly.

Winter carnival

The Winter Carnival has been rescheduled for this Thursday and the weather is looking great! Students will represent Bramfield Park in netball, soccer and hockey at the interschool carnival. We wish all our students a wonderful day and enjoy the competition. Thank you to all the teachers, coaches and umpires who will be assisting on the day.

NCCD

This week will be completing the 'Nationally Consistent Collection of Data' (NCCD) on Students with Disability. The information included in the link below is very useful for parents, as many students can fall into this collection of data, regardless of a formal diagnosis. The NCCD is a collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability and the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students. Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability.

The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, Principals, educational authorities and governments to better support students with disability at school.

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD. Data is collected within each school. Personal details, such as student names or student identifiers, are not provided to federal education authorities.
