Last year a Building Condition Assessment report was completed for every school. \$35 million of the funding will be used to address minor works listed in these reports. I will be liaising with our local state member of Parliament, Chris Tallentire, to identify works and projects that can be undertaken at Bramfield Park.

Term 3 finishes this week and all students and staff will enjoy a two week break before coming back for the start of Term 4 which will be Monday 14th October. I hope you enjoy the holidays and that the sun is shining for a lot of outdoor activities!

Finally, Mr Mike Gilders who was Deputy Principal at Bramfield Park PS has obtained a permanent Deputy Principal position in another school and will not be returning to Bramfield Park. I would like to thank Mr Gilders for contributions made while he was here and wish him every success in the future.
