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Dear families,

We have had a great start to Term 3 and the students have settled in well to learning tasks. As you will have seen from the Term Planner (located in the Flexischools app or on our website) it is looking to be a busy term. This planner will be updated as more events are confirmed and information will be updated in the newsletter. Please make sure you are receiving regular communication from our school either through email, SMS messaging, the Flexischools app or Facebook.

### Cross Country

Last Friday, in the beautiful sunshine, we had our school Cross Country carnival. All of our students competed with such wonderful sportsmanship and endeavour and it was wonderful to hear the support and encouragement as students crossed the finish line. From the results, Mr Huston has selected our interschool team that will be competing on Friday 7th August. ### Morning Routine

We are happy with how the students are coming in to school in the morning and transitioning to class, ready to start their day of learning. We are taking the opportunity to touch base with students in the undercover area before they head to class, giving reminders and information the students need for the day. Please make sure your child comes to the new undercover area as soon as they arrive at school. This includes all of our students, Kindy to Year 6. We also have breakfast available on Thursday and Friday for families before heading off to class.

### Enrolments 2021

Enrolments for our Kindy program are filling up fast, with only a handful of places still available for children turning 4 before June 30, 2021. Please see the Office for an application for enrolment form as soon as possible. Students graduating at the end of 2020 also need to be planning for high school enrolment. Staff are working with Yule Brook College to begin orientation processes to assist students with the move to high school in 2021. Parents of Year 6 students, please ensure you have made contact with the high school where you are hoping to enrol your child next year.

### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) is a yearly count of students by all Australian schools across the country. The aim of the NCCD is to provide the Australian Government with information about the number of students with disability in Australian schools and the type of adjustments they need in order to access and participate in education on the same basis as other students.

Your child will be included in the NCCD if they require ongoing adjustments at school due to a disability as defined by the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (the DDA). This is a very broad definition of disability, which includes physical and intellectual disabilities, learning disorders such as dyslexia and dysgraphia, and mental health conditions such as anxiety and depression.

If your child has a disability, we will provide information about them for the NCCD, including:

- your child's year of schooling
- the category of disability that best describes your child's difficulties (one of four categories is chosen by the school team to reflect your child's greatest area of need: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the level of adjustment your child receives at school (one of four levels is chosen by the school team to reflect the type of support your child requires: quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary adjustment, substantial adjustment, or extensive adjustment).

While it is not possible for schools or families to 'opt out' of the NCCD, the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is treated with utmost importance. Data is collected within each school, and personal details, such as student names and other identifying information, are not provided to local or federal education authorities. ## Healthy Minds, Healthy Bodies, Healthy Spirits

The "Unstoppable Me" in school wellbeing program will run every Tuesday until the end of term. Presented by Linda Bancroft from Wellbeing4Kids, Unstoppable Me combines physical stretches, breathing and relaxation exercises that have been linked to the WA curriculum—Health and Wellbeing.

In their 30 minute sessions, students will develop a greater body awareness breathing techniques to calm the body and mind when faced with challenging situations.
