### **Year 4 PEAC Testing**

The PEAC Program provides part time extension and enrichment for exceptionally able students in Years 5 and 6. All students in Year 4 will have the opportunity to be assessed for suitability for the PEAC Program. Testing at Bramfield Park Primary School will occur between Monday 12 October to Friday 30th October 2020. The scores from the test will be used in the selection of students for PEAC courses and extension programs during 2021 and also to inform educational provision in schools. If you do not wish your child to be included in the PEAC assessment, please notify the school in writing by the end of Term 3 Friday 25 September 2020.

The School has recently been made aware of an aggressive swooping magpie located near the primary school. Magpies are protected under the Wildlife Conservation Act and therefore removing the magpie or its nest is illegal.
