## **NAIDOC**

Tomorrow Bramfield Park celebrates NAIDOC Week. The theme for this year is *For Our Elders*. Across every generation, our Elders have played, and continue to play, an important role and hold a prominent place in our communities and families. NAIDOC stands for National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee.

In 1955, the Day of Mourning or Aborigines Day was moved from the Sunday before January 26 to the first Sunday in July. It was shifted because people wanted to focus more on celebrating First Nations cultures rather than protesting. The National Aborigines Day Observance Committee was then created in 1956 to organise national events.

In 1975, it was decided to celebrate for a whole week — rather than just one day. NAIDOC Week was born! Then in 1991, NAIDOC Week expanded to recognise Torres Strait Islander people and cultures.

At Bramfield Park we will have an assembly in the morning and then classes will work with Aunty Josie and local Elders on a variety of activities. Thank you to Mrs Landsborough, Mrs Viner, Aunty Josie and our Culture and Community committee for organising the NAIDOC activities.

#### Winter Carnival

What a fantastic carnival we had last Friday. Not only were we successful in winning a shield in every sport, but all of our athletes representing Bramfield Park PS did so with pride, sportsmanship and friendly competitiveness. Being Bored is Good

Gaming and devices fill so much of our children's time but being bored has huge lifelong benefits. Boredom is a state of unending possibilities and children learn to fill their time with meaningful activities.

A bit of boredom is not a bad thing — in fact it can actually do children some good, say experts at the Australian Government-funded parenting website raisingchildren.net.au. "When children are required to find something to do, they're forced to use their problem-solving skills, creative thinking and imagination to play," says Associate Professor Julie Green. "It's important for parents to

play with their children but they don't have to entertain them all the time."


Boredom can also allow children to:

- -let their thoughts and imaginations roam
- -explore ideas and think creatively
- -choose activities that match moods for example, if your child is feeling full of energy, they might want and need to be physically active.

Boredom gives children practice in making their own decisions and finding ways to be interested in what's going on around them as they find things to do to fill their own time. It boosts their imagination, creativity and problem solving as they find activities to fill their own time.


